Texas Realty Capital Donates \$25,000 for Healthy Trees



Texas Realty Capital, under its "Funding the Future" program, selected TLTF and CASA of Travis County to receive its first annual charitable contributions. "We're happy to help TLTF improve the Trail, making the community such a unique and fantastic place to live, work and play," said John Morran of Texas

Realty Capital. "Zilker Bluffs Tree Planting is a valuable addition that Austin's citizens and visitors will be able to enjoy for years to come." Each organization received \$25,000 marking TRC's commitment to support locally based charities that focus on Central Texas' youth, environment and services. The generous contribution helped us complete the Zilker Bluffs Tree Planting, part of Healthy Trees for the Trail.

The Healthy Trees for the Trail program restores the natural woodland habitat of the Town Lake ecosystem and protects the health of the trees along the Town Lake Hike and Bike Trail. Over the last 40 years, the introduction of non-native plant species combined with the urbanization of this area has resulted in an ecosystem with diminishing biodiversity. Without natural controls such as

floods and fire, these woodlands along the Trail have the potential to lose their beauty and functionality as native habitat. Introduced plants such as privet, Chinese tallow, chinaberry, bamboo, and giant reed grass are spreading along the Trail, crowding out native species important to birds and other wildlife for food and shelter. Aggressive grapevines are shading out large specimen trees that help make the Trail a special place. We are planning work days for the spring. To volunteer, email volunteers@townlaketrail.org.

Zilker Bluffs Tree Planting & Adoption

The stars aligned over the Zilker Bluffs tree planting project in November and December, when every component of the first phase rapidly fell into place. TLTF contracted to have 27 oaks and cedar elms planted on the perfectly shaped berms, designed by Sitio Design and constructed by Pitts Construction.

Volunteers, many from Freescale, planted the smaller trees and grasses. Thanks to Brack Green of the Parks Department, the plantings received initial watering via special water trucks that deliver water under pressure into the irrigation pipes. And then the rains came! January enjoyed abundant rain that is getting our lovely trees off to the best possible start.

On March 3, volunteers from Marathon Real Estate will weed and fertilize. Later in the spring, phase two will see the planting of hundreds of plugs of Central Texas wildflowers and grasses, especially grown for TLTF by Madrone Nursery, San Marcos.
