Clay Pit Bucket Towers

At 35 feet high and located right on the Trail, these two 120 year old structures hide in plain sight. Built in 1902 by A.J. Zilker, the two towers are the only remaining parts of a cable conveyor system that carried alluvial clay from south of the Colorado River to be used at Zilker's Austin Brick Company brick works on a bluff behind today's Austin High School. In 1912, Butler Brick took over the brick works and operated this cross river conveyor system until 1942.
