Peace Peninsula

When you stand <u>under</u> the second Gazebo and look across the lake, you'll notice that the water level remains the same. That is thanks to the Longhorn Dam. Before 1960, this area was a vast gravel-mining complex. And the round lagoon you see behind the peninsula was once a quarry!

This very peninsula also served as a crossing point for the low areas of the Colorado River. At the end of the peninsula, you will see a majestic Cypress tree standing proudly. If you shift your view to the opposite bank (Northwest), you'll spot a low point resembling a boat ramp. It raises the question of whether it was an anchor point for ferries that crossed the river in the 1850s.
