Comprehensive Signage Plan (entire Trail)

Excellent signage is a critical component of a successful urban trail. TTC has already completed a Master Signage Package that has been installed west of I-35 that includes wayfinding and spoke trails signs. This signage promotes a favorable image of Austin characterized by originality, quality, beauty and civic pride. Not only does the master signage package need to be installed on the Trail's east side, an inventory of all remaining Trail signs needs to be completed so that all signage is comprehensive coordinated and functional.

Ecological Restoration (entire Trail)

The Trail Foundation's Ecological Restoration program is now entering its fifth year of implementation. Using the Ecological Restoration Guidelines as reference for this ongoing work, this program continues to grow in sophistication and impact for the health of the Trail and surrounding parkland ecosystems. This program encourages the strategic use of resources from all city departments, including the Parks and Recreation Department, Forestry and Watershed Protection, to have the greatest impact to the ecological and aesthetic value of an exceptional natural resource: our Trail.

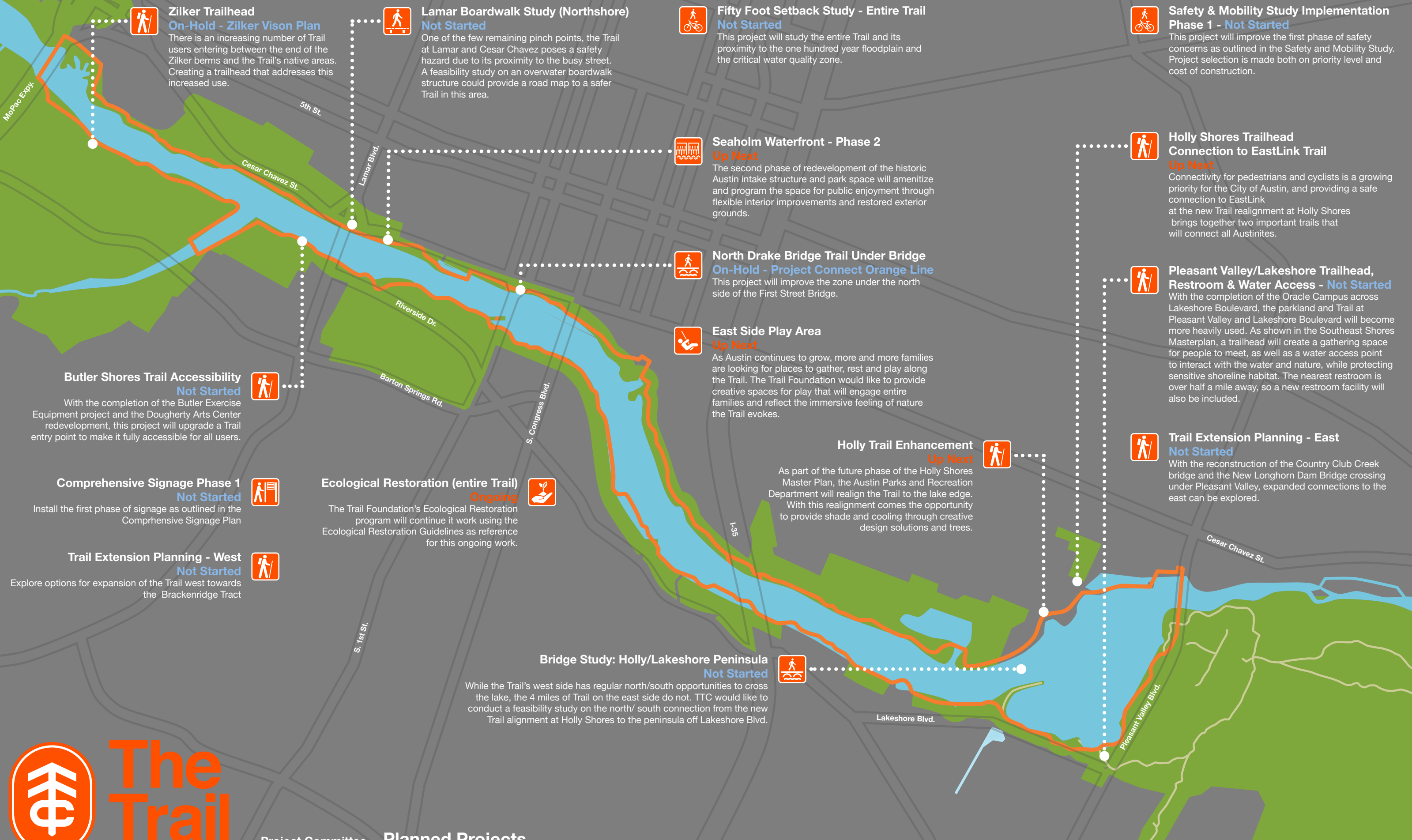

Zilker Trailhead
On-Hold - Zilker Vision Plan
 There is an increasing number of Trail users entering between the end of the Zilker berms and the Trail's native areas. Creating a trailhead that addresses this increased use.

Lamar Boardwalk Study (Northshore)
Not Started
 One of the few remaining pinch points, the Trail at Lamar and Cesar Chavez poses a safety hazard due to its proximity to the busy street. A feasibility study on an overwater boardwalk structure could provide a road map to a safer Trail in this area.

Fifty Foot Setback Study - Entire Trail
Not Started
 This project will study the entire Trail and its proximity to the one hundred year floodplain and the critical water quality zone.

Safety & Mobility Study Implementation Phase 1
Not Started
 This project will improve the first phase of safety concerns as outlined in the Safety and Mobility Study. Project selection is made both on priority level and cost of construction.

Seaholm Waterfront - Phase 2
Up Next
 The second phase of redevelopment of the historic Austin intake structure and park space will amenitize and program the space for public enjoyment through flexible interior improvements and restored exterior grounds.

Holly Shores Trailhead Connection to EastLink Trail
Up Next
 Connectivity for pedestrians and cyclists is a growing priority for the City of Austin, and providing a safe connection to EastLink at the new Trail realignment at Holly Shores brings together two important trails that will connect all Austinites.

North Drake Bridge Trail Under Bridge
On-Hold - Project Connect Orange Line
 This project will improve the zone under the north side of the First Street Bridge.

Pleasant Valley/Lakeshore Trailhead, Restroom & Water Access
Not Started
 With the completion of the Oracle Campus across Lakeshore Boulevard, the parkland and Trail at Pleasant Valley and Lakeshore Boulevard will become more heavily used. As shown in the Southeast Shores Masterplan, a trailhead will create a gathering space for people to meet, as well as a water access point to interact with the water and nature, while protecting sensitive shoreline habitat. The nearest restroom is over half a mile away, so a new restroom facility will also be included.

East Side Play Area
Up Next
 As Austin continues to grow, more and more families are looking for places to gather, rest and play along the Trail. The Trail Foundation would like to provide creative spaces for play that will engage entire families and reflect the immersive feeling of nature the Trail evokes.

Holly Trail Enhancement
Up Next
 As part of the future phase of the Holly Shores Master Plan, the Austin Parks and Recreation Department will realign the Trail to the lake edge. With this realignment comes the opportunity to provide shade and cooling through creative design solutions and trees.

Trail Extension Planning - East
Not Started
 With the reconstruction of the Country Club Creek bridge and the New Longhorn Dam Bridge crossing under Pleasant Valley, expanded connections to the east can be explored.

Butler Shores Trail Accessibility
Not Started
 With the completion of the Butler Exercise Equipment project and the Dougherty Arts Center redevelopment, this project will upgrade a Trail entry point to make it fully accessible for all users.

Comprehensive Signage Phase 1
Not Started
 Install the first phase of signage as outlined in the Comprehensive Signage Plan

Trail Extension Planning - West
Not Started
 Explore options for expansion of the Trail west towards the Brackenridge Tract

Ecological Restoration (entire Trail)
Ongoing
 The Trail Foundation's Ecological Restoration program will continue its work using the Ecological Restoration Guidelines as reference for this ongoing work.

Bridge Study: Holly/Lakeshore Peninsula
Not Started
 While the Trail's west side has regular north/south opportunities to cross the lake, the 4 miles of Trail on the east side do not. TTC would like to conduct a feasibility study on the north/ south connection from the new Trail alignment at Holly Shores to the peninsula off Lakeshore Blvd.
