## Phase 3 Community Engagement

### **Project Description**

The Holly Shores/Edward Rendon Sr. Park at Festival Beach Vision Plan guides a vision for the revitalized open space that will integrate the decommissioned Holly Street Power Plant site with the existing open space. The Trail Conservancy (TTC) is working with Rialto Studio, Cultural Strategies, the City of Austin, and Jorge Sanhueza-Lyon to create schematic designs for three of the projects identified in the Vision Plan for the Holly Shores area of the Ann and Roy Butler Hike-and-Bike Trail (the Trail). Those projects include a new play area, Trailhead, and Trail enhancements. These projects may be combined after this phase for fundraising purposes.

#### **Schematic Design Overview + Goals**

"Schematic Design" refers to the first phase of the design process where the project team turns a concept into drawings of what the concept could look like when it is built. The Phase 2 Community Engagement has provided input from the community for the project team to refine the designs. For the next Phase of Community Engagement, the goals are to:

- Present the previous feedback data from Phase 2 to advisory committees to review and ensure that TTC understands the stakeholders' and communities' priorities and values for the project.
- Get feedback on the refinement of selected design concepts, ideas, and options with outlined desires and priorities.

This document is a report of findings from Phase 3's community engagement.

#### **Evaluation**

For Phase 3 of the Holly Area Comprehensive Project community engagement, The Trail Conservancy's goal was to identify the priorities and values of participants for the project by evaluating responses to the multiple engagement activities including:

- Survey responses,
- Open house comments on design boards, and
- Small group comments on design boards and in discussion

Responses were analyzed for each activity in the following ways:

- All written or spoken responses from the above activities were tagged and summarized into different categories (see categories list on pages 6-7).
- All survey questions that were multiple choice, scale range and ranking were quantified into numeric form.
- Small groups' responses included Camacho and Mendez staff

All category totals were collected and indicated the top 10 with the highest totals. The top 10 were added to the results for the more detailed survey guestion answers.

#### **Key Take-Aways**

Over all methods of engagement, there was positive feedback that the designs supported the community input previously received.

Across the activities listed in "Evaluation" above:

- The highest categories with the most positive comments were: "Drinking fountains (people & pets)" and "Bike skills course."
- "Restrooms" was the third highest category. This was not a specific question in the engagement, but people requested more or better facilities in the comments.
- Following that, people showed interest in shade structures and water views.

From the small group discussions with staff at Camacho Activity Center and Mendez Recreation Center who use these spaces regularly for their adult and children's programming:

- Both groups had positive comments on the concept designs.
- Camacho commented on needing kayak access and a barrier along the parking lot for safety.
- Mendez commented on children requesting a zipline and having a place for hammocks and interpretive signage.

From the online survey questions and responses:

- Feedback identified the following five top categories in order of importance:
  - Drinking fountains (people & pets)
  - Bike skills course
  - Shade trees/more trees
  - Lighting
  - Shade structures
- Feedback indicated that people requested restrooms more than lighting and shade structures above (this was not a category, but had many specific comments on this topic so it is included).

## **Engagement Methods & Strategies**

#### Methods:

For this phase of community engagement, The Trail Conservancy utilized the following methods to gather community input:

- 1. A survey tool available online and in-person in English or Spanish, 237 online surveys completed, active from April 12 May 20, 2025
- 2. Neighborhood Open Houses inside the Camacho Activity Center (April 12, 2025) and Mendez Recreation Center (April 22, 2025) which included:
  - a. Discussions and sticky note comments
- 3. Design presentations at the following neighborhood groups:
  - a. February 26, 2025: East Town Lake Citizens Neighborhood Association (ETLCNA) town hall
  - b. April 16, 2025: East Cesar Chavez Neighborhood monthly meeting
  - c. May 8, 2025: East Town Lake Citizens Neighborhood Association (ETLCNA) town hall
  - d. May 13, 2025: Holly Neighborhood Association quarterly meeting
- 4. Tabling at The Trail Conservancy's Holly Shores Bio Blitz on April 26, 2025
- 5. Small groups with the following identified groups:
  - a. May 14, 2025: Lorraine "Grandma" Camacho Staff
  - b. May 30, 2025: Rodolfo "Rudy" Mendez Recreation Center staff

The Trail Conservancy interacted with 373 people, with 136 in-person interactions and 237 survey participants.

#### **Communication Strategies:**

The Trail Conservancy digitally communicated details of this project through social media channels and email newsletters. Between March and May of 2025, TTC posted about the project ten times on social media, reaching 5,492 users with engagement from 120.

Project engagement opportunities were sent out to TTC's email audience of 16,184 via an inclusion in TTC's March and April monthly newsletter and through a dedicated email about the project on May 6th. The Holly Project page had a total of 7 clicks from the March newsletter and 10 clicks from the April newsletter. The May 6th email had 362 unique clicks on the engagement #3 survey link.

TTC also included project and engagement opportunities on TheTrailConservancy.org website to encourage stakeholders to attend an event or participate in the online survey.

Additionally, TTC reached out to the neighborhoods east of Chalmers Ave. and west of Pleasant Valley by going door to door and dropping off 375 postcards. Those postcards had a QR code scanning total of 17 scans. As documented below, flyers were posted at local businesses and community centers and handed out during tabling opportunities, neighborhood presentations, and small groups.




## **Demographics**

The Trail Conservancy gathered self-identified demographic data through the survey. 214 out of 237 participants opted in to sharing this information. All participants responded to the English version. The following charts walk through the data collected.




Of the 214 survey respondents who answered this question, most identified as White (66.36%), with the second-highest identification as Hispanic/Latino/a/x (15.42%) The total identification of people of color is 26.17%. Two respondents selected "Other (Please specify)" and wrote "Middle East", "Indian", "Asian American", and "Slovak/German".

#### What is your age range?




The two highest responses were for the age ranges "35-44" (25.70%) and "45-54" (23.83%).

#### What is your gender identification?



Of the 214 responses, respondents were 53.74% "Woman" and 39.72% "Man," with three selecting "Non-binary" and ten "Prefer not to answer".

#### What is your zipcode?



\*63.38% of respondents listed their zip code under "Other".

13.15% of survey respondents (28) were from the 78702 zip code, which serves the Holly neighborhood and the surrounding neighborhoods east of IH-35 and north of Lady Bird Lake. This zip code represents the project's key stakeholders. This number is almost a quarter of the number of 78702 survey respondents from engagement #2 (98 participants). Data from the online survey was also disaggregated to explore potential differences in responses among participants who identified as a person of color or who lived in the 78702 zip code. There were no significant differences among responses when disaggregated based on race/ethnicity. Slight differences are noted between those who live in 78702 in comparison to the aggregate in the following answers:

- Trail Enhancements "Does this design support the feedback?" 78702 respondents had a slightly lower "Yes" response of 77.8% (compared to 80.4%).
- Trail Enhancements "Is the balance good between native areas and lawn spaces in this design?" 78702 respondents had a slightly lower "Yes" response of 74.1% (compared to 84.8%).
- Comments included:
  - Bike courses not natural
  - Meadows are too wild for blankets
  - Add a bike wash station

- How much meadow to be used for dirt biking / pump track?
- Trailhead "Does this design support the feedback?" 78702 respondents had a slightly lower "Yes" response of 74.1% (compared to 82.5%). Comments included:
  - Idea 2 received more favorable responses, but added existing parking. Makes no sense.
  - Natural areas should be off limits to humans.
  - Existing bathroom plan?
  - Permeable surfacing for parking
  - More concrete access points
  - Railroad tracks


## **Survey Tool**

Printed paper surveys were also available physically during the open houses, but were not filled out by anyone. The survey included multiple-choice questions, priority rankings, and open comment boxes. Of the 237 respondents, 232 left 579 comments.

The survey began by asking about the play area.



#### Q1 Does this design support the feedback?



The total answers for "Yes" were 82.33%. "No" was 4.31% and "Maybe/Unsure" was 13.36%.

Sample Comments "Is there anything we missed?" "No, this design covers everything."

"The nature wildflower restoration and restoration buffers are absolutely needed in the areas mentioned above. As someone who's rented the fiesta gardens venue for 10 years, I'm very excited to see the renovations and improvements to the area."

"We would just really love a proper zip line. I think it serves tweens interests really well to keep kids playing outside and engaged longer with nature..."

"The line of sight from the lawn should allow you to see the water and keep eye on kids in play areas."

## Q2 Are there elements or spaces that are still needed for certain age groups such as teens or seniors? If so, what are they?

Answered: 105 Skipped: 132

This question was answered with a comment box. The top three answer categories were:

- "Bike skills course"
- "Accessible Connections, surfacing and features"
- "Elements for Teens + Adults + Seniors"

"As a 26 yr old, I love the nooks!"


"It's hard for seniors to sit down on a lawn and get back up. Maybe benches surrounding with shade. Maybe a stage for community performances."

"It would be good to have additional benches alongside the trails for seniors to take breaks".



## Q3 Does this design support the feedback?



The total answers for "Yes" were 82.49%. "No" was 2.30% and "Maybe/Unsure" was 15.21%.

Sample Comments to "Is there anything we missed?":


"Bathroom on this part of the trail."

"Anything you can do to minimize the impact of the large Austin Energy walls on the space would be great! Whether its how you plant near that, new features to obscure them, or painting them - anything would be appreciated!"

"Shortcuts that people and bikes will use across site"

"I would love to see a natural surface bike skills area and pump track with no focus on skateboards in this area."

## Q4 Is the balance good between native areas and lawn spaces in this design?



The total answers for "Yes" were 84.83%. "No" was 3.32% and "Maybe/Unsure" was 11.85%.

Sample Comments to "Is there anything we missed?":

"I'm in favor of less manicured (requiring watering, maintenance) space to wild, native areas

"Too much hard surface."

"We should focus more on well designed lawn spaces that encourage outdoor activities and community spaces, rather than nature areas for this design."

"However we can protect/enhance the natural area while adding the bike amenities is key."

## Q5 Are there any other features that are needed to increase the comfort of the Trail?

Answered: 88 Skipped: 149

#### Comments included:

- Shade
- Lighting
- Trash cans
- Bathrooms
- Drinking fountains
- Bike repair station
- Seating bottle fillers

#### Sample Comments:

"Honestly, even more shade along the trail."

"More lighting at night!!"

"More bathrooms and water fountains on this side. If there are secluded areas ensuring they're well-lit.

"More water bottle filling areas for runners in the heat."



Q6 We received many comments requesting the following items and they have been added to the designs. Safety lighting on the Trail and in the play area Lake Overlooks Drinking fountains Do you have any additional comments?

"Lighting is great!"


"Please try to make sure that construction activity does not take away from the use of

baseball fields. I understand that space will be limited, but the baseball fields are important to the community. I imagine the temptation to eat up space from the baseball fields will be hard to resist, but the baseball fields serve many families who have been traditionally ignored by COA."

"Love the trail and thank you for the services - best part of Austin."



#### Q7 Do you feel that this design supports the feedback?



The total answers for "Yes" were 82.46%. "No" was 1.90% and "Maybe/Unsure" was 15.64%.

Sample Comments to "Is there anything we missed?":

"I think that all picnic areas need to be well covered (I.e. have large shades overhead. Branch shade only works at certain times of the day."

"Where is the new restroom?"

"Fruit trees and native perennial understory of shade trees would be a valuable landscape design aspect."

"Love the lawn cesped".

"Bike path and play area for kids".

## Q8 Is there anything else that you'd like to share about the designs?

Answered: 65 Skipped: 172

#### Sample comments:

"Beautiful"

"We need more signs outlining dog leash laws, biking etiquette, and sharing the trail etiquette."

"Is there really a need for that much space devoted to parking?"

"I like the natural, rugged look of the space (in the mock ups)."
"Don't love the lawns unless it has a view of the lake."

Other miscellaneous comments that were provided by respondents included requests for restrooms.

## **Open Houses**

#### In-Person Open Houses

TTC hosted two in-person neighborhood open houses, collecting data via project boards and conversations. Participants were walked through the previous engagement's feedback and selected and refined design ideas and asked to provide feedback and guidance to validate the designs with the feedback development. Participants were invited to leave sticky note comments to the design idea plans from the second phase.







## Q12 What is your gender identification?








