ABOUT THE TRAIL CONSERVANCY:

The Trail Conservancy (TTC) is the nonprofit steward of the Ann and Roy Butler Hike-and-Bike Trail at Lady Bird Lake. Through a Park Operations and Maintenance Agreement with the City of Austin, TTC manages the ecological restoration, public programming, and daily operations of the 10-mile Trail and its surrounding 300 acres of parkland.

In 2023, TTC launched the Art + Culture Plan for the Butler Trail, marking the end of a longstanding moratorium on art in the park. This bold initiative aims to:

- Inspire innovative, site-specific art that surprises and engages Trail users
- Highlight environmental awareness and stewardship
- Celebrate the Trail's connection to the broader community, watershed, and ecosystem.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

TEMPO on the Trail is a temporary public art exhibition presented in partnership by the City of Austin's Art in Public Places (AIPP) program and The Trail Conservancy (TTC). As part of the City's TEMPO public art program, this initiative brings site-specific artworks to public spaces, sparking imagination, inspiring creativity, and encouraging exploration.

For this iteration, 8–10 artists or artist teams will be selected through a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) process to create original, temporary works along the Ann and Roy Butler Hike-and-Bike Trail at Lady Bird Lake.

Each selected project will receive an all-inclusive budget of \$15,000–\$25,000, depending on the scale and medium. Acceptable media include:

- 3D Sculptures
- 2D Murals
- New Media (e.g., projection, sound, light-based installations)

All artworks must be designed for outdoor installation and be able to withstand weather and public interaction throughout the exhibition.

Artists are encouraged to draw inspiration from the Trail's natural setting and cultural significance, fostering community connection and thoughtful engagement.









APPLICATION PROCESS

Applications must be submitted through SlideRoom by 11:59PM on September 8, 2025. A nominal \$5.00 fee is due upon submission. Each applicant is required to provide the following materials:

Application Submission

- Artist/Team Credentials: CV/Resume (limit to 2 pages), including a summary of the artist or artist team background and qualifications, as well as public art experience.
- **Portfolio:** Images (4-8) of previous relevant work or projects that demonstrate artistic ability and technical capacity. Each image should be labeled with the title, date, location, and materials.

Short Answer Questions

- Artist Statement. What does the selection panel need to know about you to better understand your work as an artist? 2500 character limit
- What is your preferred art medium for this application? 1500 character limit
- How does site-specificity inform your artistic practice? 1500 character limit
- Artist Abstract. General concept and/or idea for this particular project. This can be submitted as a written summary or loosely sketched concept. 1500 character limit, optional upload
- How does your art respond to the locations around the Butler Trail? 2500 character limit

Site Selection (optional)

Applicants may indicate up to three preferred sites that best suit their artwork. While your
preferences will be taken into account, final placement will be determined by the selection panel.

VIRTUAL OPEN HOUSE

TTC will host a virtual Open House, where artists can learn more about the TEMPO on the Trail project, ask questions, and become familiar with the project's guidelines, expectations, and application process.

QUALIFICATIONS

The **TEMPO on the Trail** is open to practicing visual artists who meet the following criteria:

- Age: Artists must be at least 18 years of age.
- Residency: Artists must reside or work in one of the following counties:
 - Bastrop

- Burnet
- Hays

Williamson

Blanco

- Caldwell
- Travis

Eligibility

- Artists currently under a temporary contract with AIPP or TTC are eligible to apply.
- Temporary City of Austin employees are eligible to apply.
- Full-time City of Austin and TTC employees are not eligible.
- Artists who were selected as part of TEMPO on the Trail 2024-2025 are **not** eligible.

. Previous TEMPO Commissions

 Artists or artist teams who have received two previous TEMPO commissions (either as an individual or as a team member) are not eligible to apply.

. First-Time Applicants

 Artists who have not previously received a public art commission are encouraged to submit their qualifications for consideration.

Submission Limit

- Only one submission per artist or artist team will be accepted.
- Artists may not apply both individually and as a team member for separate projects.
- Incomplete or Late Applications will be disqualified.

EVALUATION CRITIRIA

The Selection Review Panel will review and consider the following evaluation criteria:

- Creativity and Artistic Merit: The quality, originality, and creativity of past work(s), including technical skill, conceptual depth, and innovation.
- Contextual Relevance: Artist ability to respond to and integrate with the physical context of the Trail, including natural surroundings, architecture, and cultural significance.
- **Community Impact:** Evidence of the artist's demonstrated ability to engage with the public and surrounding communities through previous works. The panel will assess the potential for artwork to inspire and involve visitors on the Trail.
- Relations to Local Neighborhoods: The artist's understanding of and connection to the areas and neighborhoods around the Trail, and how the artwork may reflect or enrich the community's identity, culture, or history.
